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## ENEL RUSSIA RELEASES 2020 OPERATING RESULTS

**Moscow, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021** – PJSC Enel Russia released its operating data for the fourth quarter and the full year of 2020.

**Stephane Zweguintzow**, General Director of Enel Russia, said: “*Net of change of asset portfolio, our 2020 production was mostly impacted by the lower energy consumption in the first price zone*”.

- **Net power output** showed negative dynamics in 2020 compared to 2019 mostly due to change of the company's perimeter after Reftinskaya power plant disposal, as well as due to lower demand on the



## Russian electricity market.

Gas power plants' net power output was slightly lower (-5.3%) compared to the previous year, impacted by lower power demand in the First price zone due to the slowdown of economic activity in the area, and specifically:

- Nevinnomysskaya's and Sredneuralskaya's output decreased (-7.1% and -9.9% respectively) mostly caused by planned maintenance activities on CCGT units, which took place in the middle of 2020.  
While on a positive side, Konakovskaya's output slightly increased (+2.2%) due to higher loading by the System Operator during the third quarter of 2020.

- **Heat sales** in 2020 showed mixed dynamics across geographical zones, while a substantial decline of heat sales in the Urals due to higher average temperatures and disposal of Reftinskaya power plant, was compensated by a moderate increase in Central and Southern Russia due to higher demand there.

## About Enel Russia

PJSC Enel Russia is a subsidiary of Enel Group. PJSC Enel Russia operates the following three gas power plants: Konakovskaya GRES, Nevinnomysskaya GRES and Sredneuralskaya GRES. The company's total gross installed electrical capacity is 5,628.7 MW (equivalent to 5,255.4 MW net installed capacity) and thermal capacity is 2,032 Gcal/h.

Besides that, PJSC Enel Russia implements three projects in the field of wind generation: Azovskaya WPP (90 MW), Kolskaya WPP (201 MW) and Rodnikovskaya WPP (71 MW). PJSC Enel Russia's authorized capital is 35,371,898,370 roubles, which is divided into ordinary shares with a par value of 1 rouble. The Enel SpA share in the company's authorised capital is 56.43%, PFR Partners Fund I Limited's share is 7.4, RDIF Investment Management-8 share is 5.54% and other minority shareholders' share is 30.63%. PJSC Enel Russia shares are listed in Level 1 the Moscow Exchange quotation list.

The company was established in Yekaterinburg on October 27, 2004 as OJSC OGK-5. On July 7, 2009 by the resolution of Annual General Shareholders' Meeting the company was renamed OJSC Enel OGK-5 and on August 8, 2014 the Federal Tax Service registered the new version of the company's charter with the name OJSC Enel Russia. On June 25, 2015 the company changed its legal type and was renamed PJSC Enel Russia.

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
